# THIS ADDENDUM IS FOR THE PURPOSE OF RESPONDING TO THE FOLLOWING QUESTIONS AS SHOWN BELOW:

## JEA is responding to the following questions as shown below:

- 1. Add: JEA adds "1412007648 Addendum 2 Appendix B Revised Response Form"
- **2. Question:** The provided Circuit Directory only shows 2,999 miles worth of work, while the entire bid is for over 6,000 miles. Can you please provide an updated Circuit Directory?

#### **Answer:**

JEA has roughly 3000 miles of overhead distribution lines that are pruned on a 2.5-year cycle. The term of the contract is five years which means all circuits will be pruned twice in the five-year period. This is where they are seeing the mileage difference.

### 3. Question:

In the Primary Contractor Bid Workbook, the three areas in question (JEA North, South, and West) are given an assigned "Five Year Forecast # Miles/Area" of 2217.40, 2090.60, and 1697.40 respectively. Your original "Appendix A - Technical Specifications" document says an average of 1200 miles per year, but that is with the original contract length of 2.5 years and the original contract mileage of 3,003 miles. Can you please provide an updated breakdown into how many miles are expected to be completed per year for each area over the course of the five years?

## **Answer:**

JEA has roughly 3000 miles of overhead distribution lines that are pruned on a 2.5-year cycle. This is broken down by quarters and by three sides of town or districts. Each quarter has roughly 300 miles scheduled which equals to roughly 1200 miles per year. With a 2.5-year cycle and a five year contract these 3000 miles will be pruned twice in this contract term which equates to roughly 6000 miles over the five-year term.

#### 4. Question:

Is the IFB Vegetation Management Services #1412007648 bonded in any way?

**Answer:** There will be no bid bond or performance bond required for this contract.

5. Question: How does the JSEB work? Do we choose the JSEB for them or allow them to work with who they choose?

**Answer:** JEA will have a list of JSEB vendors. Once the Primary Contractor is awarded, the Primary contractor and the VM and Forestry Department will work together to select a JSEB vendor or vendors to perform mowing and other miscellaneous work that supports the Primary vendor.
