<p>Approved by the JEA Board Committee on June 30, 2026.</p> <p>This continuing service contract was originally awarded in October 2019. The solicitation was split into two separate contracts: one for overhead distribution construction and maintenance services, and one for underground distribution construction and maintenance services. Heart Utilities of Jacksonville Inc. was awarded the underground portion.</p> <p>The scope of work includes construction and maintenance of distribution facilities consisting of pre-cast and cast-in-place reinforced manholes, reinforced concrete duct banks, and open-trenched or directional-drilled conduit. The work also includes the installation and removal of primary and secondary cables, streetlights, and streetlight cables associated with an underground electrical distribution system. In addition, the contract supports projects intended to restore electricity and improve system reliability. Immediate response capabilities during emergencies and hurricanes are also required.</p> <p>The original award amount was based on historical spend as well as identified and budgeted projects at the time of award. Throughout the life of the contract, additional projects were identified, resulting in the need for prior contract increases to support operational and capital improvement needs.</p> <p>The pricing structure of the contract provides fixed labor rates during the first year, with Consumer Price Index (CPI) adjustments applicable in years two through five, including any renewals. The Annual Fuel Cost Adjustment is based on the "AAA" Diesel Fuel Price Index for Jacksonville.</p> <p>JEA previously exercised the final renewal option of the Original Agreement, extending the agreement through October 31, 2026, and increasing the contract amount as approved by the JEA Awards Committee on July 10, 2025.</p> <p>At this time, staff recommends executing an additional one (1) year extension to the agreement and increasing the contract amount by \$6,915,000.00 to support ongoing underground distribution construction and maintenance needs. Market conditions continue to reflect significantly elevated labor costs across the utility construction industry. Extending the current agreement, which limits labor rate increases to CPI-based adjustments, is considered more favorable and cost-effective than pursuing a new solicitation under current market pricing conditions.</p> <p>During the extension period, JEA plans to further evaluate market conditions and strategically develop an approach for rebidding these services at a later date to ensure continued operational support and long-term value.</p>

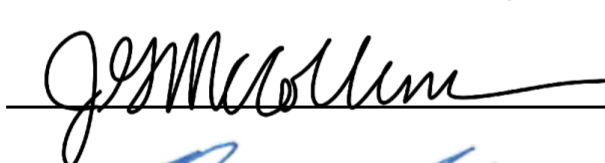

These iron-based chemicals are utilized for struvite control within the wastewater treatment process and are critical to maintaining reliable plant operations.</p> <p>JEA is currently transitioning from the primary use of Ferric Chloride to Ferric Sulfate as part of its ongoing efforts to optimize struvite control and treatment performance. The contract will provide a reliable source of supply for both chemicals to support operational flexibility during the transition period.</p> <p>The recommended award provides a cost savings compared to current contract pricing. Ferric Chloride pricing decreased by 0.35%, and Ferric Sulfate pricing decreased by 46.13%. It should be noted that Kemira submitted a bid for Ferric Chloride only, PVS Technologies submitted a bid for Ferric Sulfate only, and Pencco submitted bids for both chemicals. The recommended award reflects the lowest bid price for each chemical.</p>

<p>For additional information contact: Jason Behr</p> <p>This increase request is for the PTI Transformers LP contract to fund seven (7) additional autotransformers required for substation replacement and expansion projects identified for FY27 through FY30. The requested increase also includes funding for cost adjustments to existing transformer orders resulting from updated capacity requirements identified by the project planning team.</p> <p>These projects were not included in the original funded scope but were anticipated as part of JEA's long-term transformer replacement and system growth strategy. The additional funding will secure manufacturing production slots and associated transformer purchases needed to support these newly identified capital projects while maintaining schedule certainty in a market characterized by extended transformer lead times.</p> <p>The original Request for Proposal (RFP) was issued to establish contracts with two autotransformer manufacturers as part of a forward-looking, seven-plus-year strategy to support system replacement and expansion needs. The contracts were structured to reserve future production capacity and ensure transformer availability, as lead times for substation transformers routinely exceed three years. Following evaluation of pricing and qualifications, PTI Transformers LP and Prolec GE Waukesha, Inc. were determined to be the highest-evaluated, lowest-priced responsive and responsible proposers.</p> <p>At the time of the original award, only one (1) transformer project had been fully identified. In June 2024, an increase was approved to fund five (5) additional transformers as project needs became defined. The award documentation noted that supplemental funding requests would be presented to the Awards Committee periodically as future transformer projects were identified and approved through the budgeting process. This request is consistent with that approach and provides funding for additional transformer requirements that have since been identified for FY27 through FY30. The Prolec GE contract remains unfunded, as the next forecasted project for which Prolec GE is the lower-priced supplier is not anticipated until 2032.</p> <p>Transformer pricing under this contract continues to track the Large Specialty Transformer Producer Price Index (PPI). Since the last comparable procurement in October 2017, the PPI increased from 236.7 to 429.6 as of July 2023, representing an 81 percent increase and aligning with the pricing received under the current contract. Additionally, the contract includes a price adjustment provision that allows pricing to be updated through manufacturing release, which typically occurs approximately six months prior to shipment.</p>

The scope includes surveys, geotechnical work, process and hydraulic modeling, full design of the Arlington East Water Purification Facility and related infrastructure, preparation of the 30% basis of design, permitting, site design, all supporting disciplines, construction phase services, CMAR coordination, and compliance with the project delivery system. The new 8 mgd WPF will incorporate membrane filtration, reverse osmosis, UV AOP, membrane degasification, and post treatment stabilization.</p> <p>The hourly rates proposed for this contract are consistent with prior contracts and deemed reasonable.</p> <p>DISCUSSION/ACTION: Ted Phillips asked about the anticipated total project spend and when the project will be brought to the JEA Board of Directors for approval. The current estimate is approximately \$220,210,000.00, based on preliminary engineering estimates. As the project moves into design, firmer estimates will be developed and work packages assembled. The project will first go to the Board as an informational item once it reaches the \$25,000,000.00 threshold. <p>For additional information contact: Jason Behr</p> <p>This request seeks approval for a contract increase and the execution of the remaining Two (2) 1-Yr. Renewals under the current agreement for Security Services. Unlike the typical annual renewal approach, this action would exercise both remaining renewal option years at one time, providing continuity of service, long-term cost stability, and administrative efficiency. The requested funding increase supports both the additional two years of contract services and the increased demand for security services across JEA facilities resulting from expanded operational requirements and sustained security staffing needs.</p> <p>Maintaining the current contract and bill rates avoids the need to rebid the services and provides significant cost savings and budget certainty for JEA. If the contract were competitively rebid today, JEA would likely incur substantially higher costs due to prevailing market conditions, increased labor rates, rising operating expenses, and other contract-related cost pressures. By exercising the remaining renewal options, JEA can continue receiving critical security services at rates that are expected to be more favorable than those available through a new procurement. Additionally, the contract limits annual CPI-based rate increases to a maximum of 3 percent (3%), providing predictable and controlled cost growth while protecting JEA from larger market-driven increases.</p> <p>The requested increase also reflects the continued expansion of operational security requirements across JEA facilities, including ongoing staffing needs necessary to support regulatory compliance, employee and contractor safety, and the overall security posture of JEA operations. Approval of this request will ensure uninterrupted service, accommodate increased security demands, and provide the most cost-effective solution for maintaining security operations through the remainder of the contract term.</p> <p>DISCUSSION/ACTION: Ted Phillips inquired about the proposed two year renewal, noting that it differed from the typical one year renewal cycle. After discussion, the Committee agreed to reduce the term from the requested two-year renewal to a one year renewal and reduce the award amount accordingly. Sourcewell is a State of Minnesota local government unit and service cooperative created under the laws of the State of Minnesota (Minnesota Statutes Section 123A.21) that offers cooperative procurement solutions to government entities. Participation is open to eligible federal, state/province, and municipal governmental entities, higher education, K-12 education, nonprofit, tribal government, and other public entities located in the United States and Canada. Sourcewell issued a public solicitation for Class 4-8 Chassis and Cabs with Related Equipment, Accessories, and Services from which Supplier was awarded a contract.

Supplier desires to contract with Sourcewell to provide equipment, products, or services to Sourcewell and the entities that access Sourcewell's cooperative purchasing contracts (Participating Entities).

1. TERM OF CONTRACT

A. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Contract is effective upon the date of the final signature below.

EXPIRATION DATE AND EXTENSION. This Contract expires July 9, 2028, unless it is cancelled sooner pursuant to Article 22. This Contract allows up to three additional one-year extensions upon the request of Sourcewell and written agreement by Supplier. B. SURVIVAL OF TERMS. Unless agreed to by the Participating Entities in advance, Equipment or Products must be delivered as operational to the Participating Entity's site.

B. WARRANTY. Supplier warrants that all Equipment, Products, and Services furnished are free from liens and encumbrances, and are free from defects in design, materials, and workmanship. Supplier's dealers and distributors must agree to assist the Participating Entity in reaching a resolution in any dispute over warranty terms with the manufacturer. Any manufacturer's warranty that extends beyond the expiration of the Supplier's warranty will be passed on to the Participating Entity.

C. DEALERS, DISTRIBUTORS, AND/OR RESELLERS. Upon Contract execution and throughout the Contract term, Supplier must provide to Sourcewell a current means to validate or authenticate Supplier's authorized dealers, distributors, or resellers relative to the Equipment, Products, and Services offered under this Contract, which will be incorporated into this Contract by reference. It is the Supplier's responsibility to ensure Sourcewell receives the most current information.

3. PRICING

All Equipment, Products, or Services under this Contract will be priced at or below the price stated in Supplier's Proposal.

When providing pricing quotes to Participating Entities, all pricing quoted must reflect a Participating Entity's total cost of acquisition. This means that the quoted cost is for delivered Equipment, Products, and Services that are operational for their intended purpose, and includes all costs to the Participating Entity's requested delivery location.

Regardless of the payment method chosen by the Participating Entity, the total cost associated with any purchase option of the Equipment, Products, or Services must always be disclosed in the pricing quote to the applicable Participating Entity at the time of purchase.

B. **ADDITIONAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS/PARTICIPATING ADDENDUM.** Additional terms and conditions to a purchase order, or other required transaction documentation, may be negotiated between a Participating Entity and Supplier, such as job or industry-specific requirements, legal requirements (e.g., affirmative action or immigration status requirements), or specific local policy requirements. Some Participating Entities may require the use of a Participating Addendum, the terms of which will be negotiated directly between the Participating Entity and the Supplier or its authorized dealers, distributors, or resellers, as applicable. Any negotiated additional terms and conditions must never be less favorable to the Participating Entity than what is contained in this Contract.

C. **SPECIALIZED SERVICE REQUIREMENTS.** In the event that the Participating Entity requires service or specialized performance requirements not addressed in this Contract (such as e-commerce specifications, specialized delivery requirements, or other specifications and requirements), the Participating Entity and the Supplier may enter into a separate, standalone agreement, apart from this Contract. Sourcewell, including its agents and employees, will not be made a party to a claim for breach of such agreement.

D. **TERMINATION OF ORDERS.** Participating Entities may terminate an order, in whole or in part, immediately upon notice to Supplier in the event of any of the following events:

1. The Participating Entity fails to receive funding or appropriation from its governing body at levels sufficient to pay for the equipment, products, or services to be purchased; or
2. Federal, state, or provincial laws or regulations prohibit the purchase or change the Participating Entity's requirements.

E. **GOVERNING LAW AND VENUE.** The governing law and venue for any action related to a Participating Entity's order will be determined by the Participating Entity making the purchase.

7. CUSTOMER SERVICE

A. PRIMARY ACCOUNT REPRESENTATIVE. Supplier will assign an Account Representative to Sourcwell for this Contract and must provide prompt notice to Sourcwell if that person is changed. The Account Representative will be responsible for:

- Maintenance and management of this Contract;
- Timely response to all Sourcwell and Participating Entity inquiries; and
- Business reviews to Sourcwell and Participating Entities, if applicable.

B. BUSINESS REVIEWS. Supplier must perform a minimum of one business review with Sourcwell per contract year. The business review will cover sales to Participating Entities, pricing and contract terms, administrative fees, sales data reports, performance issues, supply issues, customer issues, and any other necessary information.

8. REPORT ON CONTRACT SALES ACTIVITY AND ADMINISTRATIVE FEE PAYMENT

A. CONTRACT SALES ACTIVITY REPORT. Each calendar quarter, Supplier must provide a contract sales activity report (Report) to the Sourcwell Supplier Development Administrator assigned to this Contract. Reports are due no later than 45 days after the end of each calendar quarter. A Report must be provided regardless of the number or amount of sales during that quarter (i.e., if there are no sales, Supplier must submit a report indicating no sales were made).

The Report must contain the following fields:

- Participating Entity Name (e.g., City of Staples Highway Department);
- Participating Entity Physical Street Address;
- Participating Entity City;
- Participating Entity State/Province;
- Participating Entity Zip/Postal Code;
- Participating Entity Contact Name;
- Participating Entity Contact Email Address;
- Participating Entity Contact Telephone Number;
- Sourcwell Assigned Entity/Participating Entity Number;
- Item Purchased Description;
- Item Purchased Price;
- Sourcwell Administrative Fee Applied; and
- Date Purchase was invoiced/sale was recognized as revenue by Supplier.

B. ADMINISTRATIVE FEE. In consideration for the support and services provided by Sourcwell, the Supplier will pay an administrative fee to Sourcwell on all Equipment, Products, and Services provided to Participating Entities. The Administrative Fee must be included in, and not added to, the pricing. Supplier may not charge Participating Entities more than the contracted

price to offset the Administrative Fee.

The Supplier will submit payment to Sourcewell for the percentage of administrative fee stated in the Proposal multiplied by the total sales of all Equipment, Products, and Services purchased by Participating Entities under this Contract during each calendar quarter. Payments should note the Supplier's name and Sourcewell-assigned contract number in the memo; and must be mailed to the address above "Attn: Accounts Receivable" or remitted electronically to Sourcewell's banking institution per Sourcewell's Finance department instructions. Payments must be received no later than 45 calendar days after the end of each calendar quarter.

Supplier agrees to cooperate with Sourcewell in auditing transactions under this Contract to ensure that the administrative fee is paid on all items purchased under this Contract.

In the event the Supplier is delinquent in any undisputed administrative fees, Sourcewell reserves the right to cancel this Contract and reject any proposal submitted by the Supplier in any subsequent solicitation. In the event this Contract is cancelled by either party prior to the Contract's expiration date, the administrative fee payment will be due no more than 30 days from the cancellation date.

9. AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE

Sourcewell's Authorized Representative is its Chief Procurement Officer.

Supplier's Authorized Representative is the person named in the Supplier's Proposal. If Supplier's Authorized Representative changes at any time during this Contract, Supplier must promptly notify Sourcewell in writing.

10. AUDIT, ASSIGNMENT, AMENDMENTS, WAIVER, AND CONTRACT COMPLETE

A. **AUDIT.** Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Section 16C.05, subdivision 5, the books, records, documents, and accounting procedures and practices relevant to this Contract are subject to examination by Sourcewell or the Minnesota State Auditor for a minimum of six years from the end of this Contract. This clause extends to Participating Entities as it relates to business conducted by that Participating Entity under this Contract.

B. **ASSIGNMENT.** Neither party may assign or otherwise transfer its rights or obligations under this Contract without the prior written consent of the other party and a fully executed assignment agreement. Such consent will not be unreasonably withheld. Any prohibited assignment will be invalid.

C. **AMENDMENTS.** Any amendment to this Contract must be in writing and will not be effective until it has been duly executed by the parties.

D. WAIVER. Failure by either party to take action or assert any right under this Contract will not be deemed a waiver of such right in the event of the continuation or repetition of the circumstances giving rise to such right. Any such waiver must be in writing and signed by the parties.

E. CONTRACT COMPLETE. This Contract represents the complete agreement between the parties. No other understanding regarding this Contract, whether written or oral, may be used to bind either party. For any conflict between the attached Proposal and the terms set out in Articles 1-22 of this Contract, the terms of Articles 1-22 will govern.

F. RELATIONSHIP OF THE PARTIES. The relationship of the parties is one of independent contractors, each free to exercise judgment and discretion with regard to the conduct of their respective businesses. This Contract does not create a partnership, joint venture, or any other relationship such as master-servant, or principal-agent.

11. INDEMNITY AND HOLD HARMLESS

Supplier must indemnify, defend, save, and hold Sourcewell and its Participating Entities, including their agents and employees, harmless from any claims or causes of action, including attorneys' fees incurred by Sourcewell or its Participating Entities, arising out of any act or omission in the performance of this Contract by the Supplier or its agents or employees; this indemnification includes injury or death to person(s) or property alleged to have been caused by some defect in the Equipment, Products, or Services under this Contract to the extent the Equipment, Product, or Service has been used according to its specifications. Sourcewell's responsibility will be governed by the State of Minnesota's Tort Liability Act (Minnesota Statutes Chapter 466) and other applicable law.

12. GOVERNMENT DATA PRACTICES

Supplier and Sourcewell must comply with the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, Minnesota Statutes Chapter 13, as it applies to all data provided by or provided to Sourcewell under this Contract and as it applies to all data created, collected, received, maintained, or disseminated by the Supplier under this Contract.

13. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY, PUBLICITY, MARKETING, AND ENDORSEMENT

A. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

1. *Grant of License.* During the term of this Contract:

- a. Sourcewell grants to Supplier a royalty-free, worldwide, non-exclusive right and license to use the trademark(s) provided to Supplier by Sourcewell in advertising and promotional materials for the purpose of marketing Sourcewell's relationship with Supplier.

b. Supplier grants to Sourcewell a royalty-free, worldwide, non-exclusive right and license to use Supplier's trademarks in advertising and promotional materials for the purpose of marketing Supplier's relationship with Sourcewell.

2. *Limited Right of Sublicense.* The right and license granted herein includes a limited right of each party to grant sublicenses to their respective subsidiaries, distributors, dealers, resellers, marketing representatives, and agents (collectively "Permitted Sublicensees") in advertising and promotional materials for the purpose of marketing the Parties' relationship to Participating Entities. Any sublicense granted will be subject to the terms and conditions of this Article. Each party will be responsible for any breach of this Article by any of their respective sublicensees.

3. *Use; Quality Control.*

a. Neither party may alter the other party's trademarks from the form provided and must comply with removal requests as to specific uses of its trademarks or logos.

b. Each party agrees to use, and to cause its Permitted Sublicensees to use, the other party's trademarks only in good faith and in a dignified manner consistent with such party's use of the trademarks. Upon written notice to the breaching party, the breaching party has 30 days of the date of the written notice to cure the breach or the license will be terminated.

4. *Termination.* Upon the termination of this Contract for any reason, each party, including Permitted Sublicensees, will have 30 days to remove all Trademarks from signage, websites, and the like bearing the other party's name or logo (excepting Sourcewell's pre-printed catalog of suppliers which may be used until the next printing). Supplier must return all marketing and promotional materials, including signage, provided by Sourcewell, or dispose of it according to Sourcewell's written directions.

B. **PUBLICITY.** Any publicity regarding the subject matter of this Contract must not be released without prior written approval from the Authorized Representatives. Publicity includes notices, informational pamphlets, press releases, research, reports, signs, and similar public notices prepared by or for the Supplier individually or jointly with others, or any subcontractors, with respect to the program, publications, or services provided resulting from this Contract.

C. **MARKETING.** Any direct advertising, marketing, or offers with Participating Entities must be approved by Sourcewell. Send all approval requests to the Sourcewell Supplier Development Administrator assigned to this Contract.

D. **ENDORSEMENT.** The Supplier must not claim that Sourcewell endorses its Equipment, Products, or Services.

14. GOVERNING LAW, JURISDICTION, AND VENUE

The substantive and procedural laws of the State of Minnesota will govern this Contract. Venue for all legal proceedings arising out of this Contract, or its breach, must be in the appropriate state court in Todd County, Minnesota or federal court in Fergus Falls, Minnesota.

15. FORCE MAJEURE

Neither party to this Contract will be held responsible for delay or default caused by acts of God or other conditions that are beyond that party's reasonable control. A party defaulting under this provision must provide the other party prompt written notice of the default.

16. SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this Contract is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be illegal, unenforceable, or void then both parties will be relieved from all obligations arising from that provision. If the remainder of this Contract is capable of being performed, it will not be affected by such determination or finding and must be fully performed.

17. PERFORMANCE, DEFAULT, AND REMEDIES

A. PERFORMANCE. During the term of this Contract, the parties will monitor performance and address unresolved contract issues as follows:

1. *Notification.* The parties must promptly notify each other of any known dispute and work in good faith to resolve such dispute within a reasonable period of time. If necessary, Sourcewell and the Supplier will jointly develop a short briefing document that describes the issue(s), relevant impact, and positions of both parties.
2. *Escalation.* If parties are unable to resolve the issue in a timely manner, as specified above, either Sourcewell or Supplier may escalate the resolution of the issue to a higher level of management. The Supplier will have 30 calendar days to cure an outstanding issue.
3. *Performance while Dispute is Pending.* Notwithstanding the existence of a dispute, the Supplier must continue without delay to carry out all of its responsibilities under the Contract that are not affected by the dispute. If the Supplier fails to continue without delay to perform its responsibilities under the Contract, in the accomplishment of all undisputed work, the Supplier will bear any additional costs incurred by Sourcewell and/or its Participating Entities as a result of such failure to proceed.

B. DEFAULT AND REMEDIES. Either of the following constitutes cause to declare this Contract, or any Participating Entity order under this Contract, in default:

1. Nonperformance of contractual requirements, or
2. A material breach of any term or condition of this Contract.

The party claiming default must provide written notice of the default, with 30 calendar days to cure the default. Time allowed for cure will not diminish or eliminate any liability for liquidated or other damages. If the default remains after the opportunity for cure, the non-defaulting party may:

- Exercise any remedy provided by law or equity, or
- Terminate the Contract or any portion thereof, including any orders issued against the Contract.

18. INSURANCE

A. REQUIREMENTS. At its own expense, Supplier must maintain insurance policy(ies) in effect at all times during the performance of this Contract with insurance company(ies) licensed or authorized to do business in the State of Minnesota having an "AM BEST" rating of A- or better, with coverage and limits of insurance not less than the following:

1. *Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability.*

Workers' Compensation: As required by any applicable law or regulation.

Employer's Liability Insurance: must be provided in amounts not less than listed below:

Minimum limits:

\$500,000 each accident for bodily injury by accident

\$500,000 policy limit for bodily injury by disease

\$500,000 each employee for bodily injury by disease

2. *Commercial General Liability Insurance.* Supplier will maintain insurance covering its operations, with coverage on an occurrence basis, and must be subject to terms no less broad than the Insurance Services Office ("ISO") Commercial General Liability Form CG0001 (2001 or newer edition), or equivalent. At a minimum, coverage must include liability arising from premises, operations, bodily injury and property damage, independent contractors, products-completed operations including construction defect, contractual liability, blanket contractual liability, and personal injury and advertising injury. All required limits, terms and conditions of coverage must be maintained during the term of this Contract.

Minimum Limits:

\$1,000,000 each occurrence Bodily Injury and Property Damage

\$1,000,000 Personal and Advertising Injury

\$2,000,000 aggregate for products liability-completed operations

\$2,000,000 general aggregate

3. *Commercial Automobile Liability Insurance.* During the term of this Contract, Supplier will maintain insurance covering all owned, hired, and non-owned automobiles in limits of liability not less than indicated below. The coverage must be subject to terms

no less broad than ISO Business Auto Coverage Form CA 0001 (2010 edition or newer), or equivalent.

Minimum Limits:

\$1,000,000 each accident, combined single limit

4. *Umbrella Insurance*. During the term of this Contract, Supplier will maintain umbrella coverage over Employer's Liability, Commercial General Liability, and Commercial Automobile.

Minimum Limits:

\$2,000,000

5. *Professional/Technical, Errors and Omissions, and/or Miscellaneous Professional Liability*. During the term of this Contract, Supplier will maintain coverage for all claims the Supplier may become legally obligated to pay resulting from any actual or alleged negligent act, error, or omission related to Supplier's professional services required under this Contract.

Minimum Limits:

\$2,000,000 per claim or event

\$2,000,000 – annual aggregate

6. *Network Security and Privacy Liability Insurance*. During the term of this Contract, Supplier will maintain coverage for network security and privacy liability. The coverage may be endorsed on another form of liability coverage or written on a standalone policy. The insurance must cover claims which may arise from failure of Supplier's security resulting in, but not limited to, computer attacks, unauthorized access, disclosure of not public data – including but not limited to, confidential or private information, transmission of a computer virus, or denial of service.

Minimum limits:

\$2,000,000 per occurrence

\$2,000,000 annual aggregate

Failure of Supplier to maintain the required insurance will constitute a material breach entitling Sourcwell to immediately terminate this Contract for default.

B. CERTIFICATES OF INSURANCE. Prior to commencing under this Contract, Supplier must furnish to Sourcwell a certificate of insurance, as evidence of the insurance required under this Contract. Prior to expiration of the policy(ies), renewal certificates must be mailed to Sourcwell, 202 12th Street Northeast, P.O. Box 219, Staples, MN 56479 or sent to the Sourcwell Supplier Development Administrator assigned to this Contract. The certificates must be signed by a person authorized by the insurer(s) to bind coverage on their behalf.

Failure to request certificates of insurance by Sourcewell, or failure of Supplier to provide certificates of insurance, in no way limits or relieves Supplier of its duties and responsibilities in this Contract.

C. **ADDITIONAL INSURED ENDORSEMENT AND PRIMARY AND NON-CONTRIBUTORY INSURANCE CLAUSE.** Supplier agrees to list Sourcewell and its Participating Entities, including their officers, agents, and employees, as an additional insured under the Supplier's commercial general liability insurance policy with respect to liability arising out of activities, "operations," or "work" performed by or on behalf of Supplier, and products and completed operations of Supplier. The policy provision(s) or endorsement(s) must further provide that coverage is primary and not excess over or contributory with any other valid, applicable, and collectible insurance or self-insurance in force for the additional insureds.

D. **WAIVER OF SUBROGATION.** Supplier waives and must require (by endorsement or otherwise) all its insurers to waive subrogation rights against Sourcewell and other additional insureds for losses paid under the insurance policies required by this Contract or other insurance applicable to the Supplier or its subcontractors. The waiver must apply to all deductibles and/or self-insured retentions applicable to the required or any other insurance maintained by the Supplier or its subcontractors. Where permitted by law, Supplier must require similar written express waivers of subrogation and insurance clauses from each of its subcontractors.

E. **UMBRELLA/EXCESS LIABILITY/SELF-INSURED RETENTION.** The limits required by this Contract can be met by either providing a primary policy or in combination with umbrella/excess liability policy(ies), or self-insured retention.

19. COMPLIANCE

A. **LAWS AND REGULATIONS.** All Equipment, Products, or Services provided under this Contract must comply fully with applicable federal laws and regulations, and with the laws in the states and provinces in which the Equipment, Products, or Services are sold.

B. **LICENSES.** Supplier must maintain a valid and current status on all required federal, state/provincial, and local licenses, bonds, and permits required for the operation of the business that the Supplier conducts with Sourcewell and Participating Entities.

20. BANKRUPTCY, DEBARMENT, OR SUSPENSION CERTIFICATION

Supplier certifies and warrants that it is not in bankruptcy or that it has previously disclosed in writing certain information to Sourcewell related to bankruptcy actions. If at any time during this Contract Supplier declares bankruptcy, Supplier must immediately notify Sourcewell in writing.

Supplier certifies and warrants that neither it nor its principals are presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from programs operated by the State of Minnesota; the United States federal government or the Canadian government, as applicable; or any Participating Entity. Supplier certifies and warrants that neither it nor its principals have been convicted of a criminal offense related to the subject matter of this Contract. Supplier further warrants that it will provide immediate written notice to Sourcwell if this certification changes at any time.

21. PROVISIONS FOR NON-UNITED STATES FEDERAL ENTITY PROCUREMENTS UNDER UNITED STATES FEDERAL AWARDS OR OTHER AWARDS

Participating Entities that use United States federal grant or FEMA funds to purchase goods or services from this Contract may be subject to additional requirements including the procurement standards of the Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards, 2 C.F.R. § 200. Participating Entities may have additional requirements based on specific funding source terms or conditions. Within this Article, all references to “federal” should be interpreted to mean the United States federal government. The following list only applies when a Participating Entity accesses Supplier’s Equipment, Products, or Services with United States federal funds.

A. **EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY.** Except as otherwise provided under 41 C.F.R. § 60, all contracts that meet the definition of “federally assisted construction contract” in 41 C.F.R. § 60-1.3 must include the equal opportunity clause provided under 41 C.F.R. §60-1.4(b), in accordance with Executive Order 11246, “Equal Employment Opportunity” (30 FR 12319, 12935, 3 C.F.R. §, 1964-1965 Comp., p. 339), as amended by Executive Order 11375, “Amending Executive Order 11246 Relating to Equal Employment Opportunity,” and implementing regulations at 41 C.F.R. § 60, “Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs, Equal Employment Opportunity, Department of Labor.” The equal opportunity clause is incorporated herein by reference.

B. **DAVIS-BACON ACT, AS AMENDED (40 U.S.C. § 3141-3148).** When required by federal program legislation, all prime construction contracts in excess of \$2,000 awarded by non-federal entities must include a provision for compliance with the Davis-Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. § 3141-3144, and 3146-3148) as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations (29 C.F.R. § 5, “Labor Standards Provisions Applicable to Contracts Covering Federally Financed and Assisted Construction”). In accordance with the statute, contractors must be required to pay wages to laborers and mechanics at a rate not less than the prevailing wages specified in a wage determination made by the Secretary of Labor. In addition, contractors must be required to pay wages not less than once a week. The non-federal entity must place a copy of the current prevailing wage determination issued by the Department of Labor in each solicitation. The decision to award a contract or subcontract must be conditioned upon the acceptance of the wage determination. The non-federal entity must report all suspected or reported violations to the federal awarding agency. The contracts must also include a provision for compliance with

the Copeland “Anti-Kickback” Act (40 U.S.C. § 3145), as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations (29 C.F.R. § 3, “Contractors and Subcontractors on Public Building or Public Work Financed in Whole or in Part by Loans or Grants from the United States”). The Act provides that each contractor or subrecipient must be prohibited from inducing, by any means, any person employed in the construction, completion, or repair of public work, to give up any part of the compensation to which he or she is otherwise entitled. The non-federal entity must report all suspected or reported violations to the federal awarding agency. Supplier must be in compliance with all applicable Davis-Bacon Act provisions.

C. CONTRACT WORK HOURS AND SAFETY STANDARDS ACT (40 U.S.C. § 3701-3708). Where applicable, all contracts awarded by the non-federal entity in excess of \$100,000 that involve the employment of mechanics or laborers must include a provision for compliance with 40 U.S.C. §§ 3702 and 3704, as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations (29 C.F.R. § 5). Under 40 U.S.C. § 3702 of the Act, each contractor must be required to compute the wages of every mechanic and laborer on the basis of a standard work week of 40 hours. Work in excess of the standard work week is permissible provided that the worker is compensated at a rate of not less than one and a half times the basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of 40 hours in the work week. The requirements of 40 U.S.C. § 3704 are applicable to construction work and provide that no laborer or mechanic must be required to work in surroundings or under working conditions which are unsanitary, hazardous or dangerous. These requirements do not apply to the purchases of supplies or materials or articles ordinarily available on the open market, or contracts for transportation or transmission of intelligence. This provision is hereby incorporated by reference into this Contract. Supplier certifies that during the term of an award for all contracts by Sourcewell resulting from this procurement process, Supplier must comply with applicable requirements as referenced above.

D. RIGHTS TO INVENTIONS MADE UNDER A CONTRACT OR AGREEMENT. If the federal award meets the definition of “funding agreement” under 37 C.F.R. § 401.2(a) and the recipient or subrecipient wishes to enter into a contract with a small business firm or nonprofit organization regarding the substitution of parties, assignment or performance of experimental, developmental, or research work under that “funding agreement,” the recipient or subrecipient must comply with the requirements of 37 C.F.R. § 401, “Rights to Inventions Made by Nonprofit Organizations and Small Business Firms Under Government Grants, Contracts and Cooperative Agreements,” and any implementing regulations issued by the awarding agency. Supplier certifies that during the term of an award for all contracts by Sourcewell resulting from this procurement process, Supplier must comply with applicable requirements as referenced above.

E. CLEAN AIR ACT (42 U.S.C. § 7401-7671Q.) AND THE FEDERAL WATER POLLUTION CONTROL ACT (33 U.S.C. § 1251-1387). Contracts and subgrants of amounts in excess of \$150,000 require the non-federal award to agree to comply with all applicable standards, orders or regulations issued pursuant to the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. § 7401- 7671q) and the Federal Water Pollution Control Act as amended (33 U.S.C. § 1251- 1387). Violations must be reported to the Federal awarding agency and the Regional Office of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).

Supplier certifies that during the term of this Contract will comply with applicable requirements as referenced above.

F. DEBARMENT AND SUSPENSION (EXECUTIVE ORDERS 12549 AND 12689). A contract award (see 2 C.F.R. § 180.220) must not be made to parties listed on the government wide exclusions in the System for Award Management (SAM), in accordance with the OMB guidelines at 2 C.F.R. §180 that implement Executive Orders 12549 (3 C.F.R. § 1986 Comp., p. 189) and 12689 (3 C.F.R. § 1989 Comp., p. 235), "Debarment and Suspension." SAM Exclusions contains the names of parties debarred, suspended, or otherwise excluded by agencies, as well as parties declared ineligible under statutory or regulatory authority other than Executive Order 12549. Supplier certifies that neither it nor its principals are presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation by any federal department or agency.

G. BYRD ANTI-LOBBYING AMENDMENT, AS AMENDED (31 U.S.C. § 1352). Suppliers must file any required certifications. 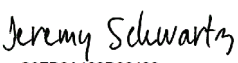

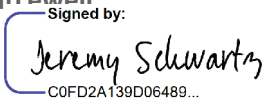

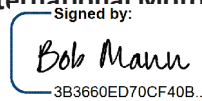

A RESOLUTION BY THE BOARD AUTHORIZING THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER/MANAGING DIRECTOR TO INCREASE THE MAXIMUM INDEBTEDNESS; AUTHORIZING THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER/MANAGING DIRECTOR OR DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE THE AGREEMENT REQUIRED ON BEHALF OF THE BOARD; PROVIDING FOR THE CORRECTION OF ERRORS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, JEA, a body politic and corporate created under chapter 78-538, Laws of Florida, as amended, and Article 21 of the City Charter, is vested with plenary authority to own, manage, and operate electric, waste, wastewater, natural gas, and other utility systems situated within and without the City in accordance with Article 21; and

WHEREAS, on October 3, 2019, JEA awarded a five-year (5 year) agreement with Heart Utilities of Jacksonville Inc. (the "Original Agreement"), with two (2) one-year renewal options in the amount of Twenty Million Nine Hundred Seventy Four Thousand Seven Hundred Thirty-Four and 30/100 Dollars (\$20,974,734.30) (the "Maximum Indebtedness") for services including construction and maintenance of distribution facilities consisting of pre-cast and cast-in-place reinforced manholes, reinforced concrete duct banks, and open-trenched or directional-drilled conduit; and

WHEREAS, the work also includes the installation and removal of primary and secondary cables, streetlights, and streetlight cables associated with an underground electrical distribution system; and

WHEREAS, the contract supports projects intended to restore electricity and improve system reliability; and

WHEREAS, on May 11, 2023, JEA increased the Maximum Indebtedness in the amount of Eight Million Fifty-One Thousand One Hundred Ten and 96/100 Dollars (\$8,051,110.96), as approved by the JEA Awards Committee, for a new Maximum Indebtedness of Twenty-Nine Million Twenty-Five Thousand Eight Hundred Forty-Five and 26/100 Dollars (\$29,025,845.26); and

WHEREAS, on July 11, 2024, JEA corrected Amendment 1 to revise and replace the Maximum Indebtedness amount as Seven Million Four Hundred One Thousand One Hundred Ten and 96/100 Dollars (\$7,401,110.96), and also again increased the Maximum Indebtedness in the amount of Three Million Five Hundred Thirty-Five Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$3,535,000.00), as approved by the JEA Awards Committee, for a new Maximum Indebtedness of Thirty One Million Nine Hundred Ten Thousand Eight Hundred Forty- Five and 26/100 Dollars (\$31,910,845.26); and

WHEREAS, on October 17, 2024, JEA increased the Maximum Indebtedness in the amount of Seven Million One Hundred Fifty Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$7,150,000.00), as approved by the JEA Awards Committee, for a new Maximum Indebtedness of Thirty-Nine Million Sixty Thousand Eight Hundred Forty-Five and 26/100 Dollars (\$39,060,845.26), and renewed the Term of the Original Agreement until October 31, 2025; and

WHEREAS, on July 10, 2025, JEA increased the Maximum Indebtedness in the amount of Six Million Eight Hundred Fifty Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$6,850,000.00), as approved by the JEA Awards Committee, for a new Maximum Indebtedness of Forty-Five Million Nine Hundred Ten Thousand Eight Hundred Forty-Five and 26/100 Dollars (\$45,910,845.26), and renewed the Term of the Original Agreement until October 31, 2026: and

WHEREAS, JEA now desires to extend the Term of the Original Agreement for one (1) year through October 31, 2027, and increase the Maximum Indebtedness in the amount of Six Million Nine Hundred Fifteen Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$6,915,000.00) which will bring the new not-to-exceed Maximum Indebtedness total to Fifty Two Million Eight Hundred Twenty Five Thousand Eight Hundred Forty Five and 26/100 Dollars (\$52,825,845.26); and

WHEREAS, during the extension period, JEA will evaluate market conditions and strategically develop an approach for rebidding these services later to ensure continued operational support and long-term value.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the JEA Board of Directors that:

1. The recitals stated above are hereby incorporated into and made part of this Resolution, and such recitals shall serve as findings of fact.
2. The Board hereby approves the terms, conditions, and provisions of the proposed Agreement, which grants a one (1) year extension of the Distribution Construction and Maintenances Service Contract through October 31, 2027, for a new maximum indebtedness of Fifty-Two Million Eight Hundred Twenty Five Thousand Eight Hundred Forty Five and 26/100 Dollars (\$52,825,845.26)
3. The Board authorizes the Chief Executive Officer/Managing Director, or designee, to execute the Documents necessary to extend the contract.
4. To the extent that there are any typographical, administrative, and/or scrivener's errors contained herein that do not change the tone, tenor, or purpose of this Resolution, then such errors may be administratively corrected with no further action required by the Board.
5. This Resolution shall be effective upon approval by the Board.
