JEA has an ongoing need for Air Release Valves (ARVs) as aging infrastructure is replaced throughout its service territory. Historically, JEA has purchased these valves on an as-needed basis through the standard inventory process, which has resulted in occasional delays due to extended lead times. Establishing a dedicated supply of these items for capital projects will improve availability, reduce warehouse storage requirements, and minimize the risk of project or operational interruptions. The recommended award amount is based on the lowest responsive and responsible bid received for each of the four required items. The total bid is approximately 5% below the business estimate, and following review, has been determined to be fair and reasonable.

The transformers will be an oil immersed, three phase, outdoor type GSU equipped with automatic, thermostatically controlled forced oil, forced air cooling, and will include all necessary accessories, spare parts, and appurtenances to ensure full operability. Delivery is included in the Response price and will be made to the nearest rail siding to the SJRPP facility. This procurement is essential to support reliable power generation and maintain long-term operational stability of the SJRPP facility. The GSUs were identified as a long-lead item with lead-time exceeding three (3) years from all approved manufacturers and some manufacturers currently quoting as far as five (5) year lead-times. In order for JEA to successfully mitigate risk to the overall project, this solicitation was evaluated using weighted selection criteria consisting of 40% price, 40% lead time, and 20% risk profile. Hitachi distinguished itself with the most competitive overall pricing, coming in approximately \$7.5 million dollars lower than Hyundai. In addition, Hitachi offered the shortest and most advantageous lead-time, delivering an estimated four-month improvement over Hyundai's schedule. Both companies demonstrated strong and comparable performance within the risk profile evaluation, further highlighting Hitachi's exceptional value and readiness. It should be noted that the original budget estimate was generated based on a scaled pricing from considerably smaller transformers as JEA has never purchased a transformer close to the size of the transformers found within the solicitation. The original solicitation included one (1) steam turbine generator step-up transformer as well as two (2) combustion turbine step-up transformers. During the July 23, 2026 Awards Committee meeting, the JEA Awards Committee approved the procurement of the one (1) steam turbine generator step-up transformer to Prolec-GE Waukesha, Inc. in the amount of \$8,403,388.00 while the evaluation of the larger combustion turbine GSU units was paused to allow additional clarification from respondents and to ensure the final comparison accurately aligned with project requirements. We are now seeking authorization to progress with the procurement of the two (2) combustion turbine GSU transformers at this time.
